Friar for the Assembly - Father Ramon Baez

Dear Brother Knights:

The last two Sundays in February bring up the readings from St Matthew's Gospel from the Sermon on the Mount. Most of us often whittle down these passages to the teaching of the "Beatitudes." In reality there is an entire discourse that is often overlooked in this precious teaching on how a Christian is supposed to live. I say that because many people, including scripture scholars and other experts, claim that the Sermon on the Mount (or the Sermon on the Plain in Luke's Gospel), is merely an ideal to strive to attain, but not very realistic. But why would Jesus give us a teaching if he did not mean for us to live by it? If Christ came into the world to save us, why pepper us with pious platitudes? "I have come to bring fire upon the earth," Jesus said in St. Luke's Gospel.

As you know, Lent begins at the end of February. Most of us will be content with doing something like giving up chocolate (as if chocolate were a required food group) or perhaps some other sacrifice like not watching "American Idol' (it's probably better for you not to watch anyway). But is that something that truly captures the essence of what Lent is about? Ask yourself whether you live by this teaching of Our Lord: "I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you?" Can I, in good faith, say that I pray for the enemies of our country? What about those who murder innocent lives, like serial killers or those in death row? What if someone caused some harm to my family? Wouldn't I wish to inflict harm on that person? These are not easy questions.

Christ poses for us some really difficult challenges in our lives. To be content with merely living Lent without challenging ourselves to go beyond that which our secular friends can do seems to miss the point of walking in the desert with Him. No one here is suggesting dressing up in sackcloth or putting ashes on the scalp as you go to your workspace. However, I don't think any of us want to settle for cheap grace, to quote a wellknown Protestant theologian.

Perhaps you are struggling with a serious sin, like pornography. Perhaps you have been a little too friendly with the nice-looking coworker in your office. Maybe you struggle with excessive gambling, or excessive pride. Perhaps you believe you are perfect and have never offended anyone, including your significant other (Ask her, and be prepared for an answer you might not like). Bring those struggles with you to the lenten desert. Ask Christ to heal your addiction, and get help if you need it. I am sure all of us can find at least one thing we need to work on in our lives: like gossip, or judging. If you don't struggle with any of these, be thankful and offer serious sacrifice or do something on behalf of someone who does. The power of prayer and faith on behalf of friends is what permitted Jesus to heal the paralytic come down from the roof. Christ will see your act of sacrifice and He will act.

May you have a blessed Lent with the Lord. May he give you the grace of perseverance. Most importantly, may you strive to live to be a person of the Beatitudes, on fire with the Gospel message, bringing mercy and conversion to all those you meet.
