Dear Brother Knights:

One of the most challenging aspects about being a member of an aircrew on a P-3 Orion had to do with the endurance of the missions. The crew often woke up at ungodly hours for briefing, a 3 hour pre-flight, followed by a grueling 8 hour mission. Then, once we landed at the base, there was a detailed two hour debrief of the mission. It was very challenging to "stay on task" and be alert for all that time. Sometimes, in the middle of a long time on station "burning holes in the sky" as we used to call it, it was particularly difficult to persevere to mission completion.

These last days of Lent as we prepare for Holy Week, it can often seem difficult to stay on task with the Lenten practices we have chosen. Our minds tend to become distracted as we lose focus. That is why Jesus had to ask his disciples "could you not watch with me for one hour? (Matt: 26:40). Perseverance is the virtue that is needed most at these moments, when we might become lethargic. We remember way back on Ash Wednesday when Jesus reminded us to keep our Lenten practices unknown but to God, who will repay our deeds.
