Friar for the Assembly - Father Jeb Donelan

Dear Brother Knights:

Believe it or not another Lent is already upon us, this February 17th will be Ash Wednesday and we will begin our Lenten journey toward Easter. Despite the pandemic and the restrictions this may bring upon us limiting things like no fish fries, no Lenten soup dinners and no community retreats but there is still so much we can get out of this lent! A look at the basics of lent I think can help us with our preparation and living out of this Lent.

Every Ash Wednesday the Gospel is always the same, Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-18, Jesus recommends the spiritual practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to his disciples. These three penitential practices are really the essence or core of Lent, while everything else is kind periphery. If you will, Lent is much more about an internal event that converts us closer to God and much less about a pesky penitence that I am going to grin and bear it for forty days. Often times, Lent even becomes like a second New Year's resolution where if I recognize that I cuss too much or am too impatient with my wife then 40 days I am done with cussing or quarrelling with my wife. Unfortunately, these only last usually two weeks and by the end of lent we have given up completely.

I would like to recommend this year a more basic approach to Lenten penances. Penances are not primarily about self-improvement they are about spiritual growth. In other words, I may still come to the end of lent and struggle with anger or lust or whatever sin I was trying to cast off but if I have grown closer to the Lord then it has been a good Lent. And eventually too I will probably start to overcome my anger, or my lust or whatever it is that I am struggling with (it is hard to pray regularly and continue to cuss like a sailor).

For this reason, I highly recommend sticking to the basics, prayer, fasting and almsgiving. For instance, a daily increase in prayer, a weekly fast or giving up a preferred food item for 40 days, or even regular tithing or some form of sacrificial almsgiving are all humbling and soul transforming experiences. If you are not in the habit of daily prayer you are going to want to give up two or three weeks in but if you push through for 40 days you will be happy you did and hopefully continue on after Easter. If you have never fasted in a regular basis it can be challenging but a beautiful way to connect to the cross of Christ. And likewise almsgiving or donating in a more serious way either to the poor or the Church is a good way to increase my trust in God and love for my neighbor. I hope the Lord Jesus enriches your lent with a true conversion of heart.

Speaking of saints on December 8, Pope Francis declared a year for St. Joseph. For all our Joseph's in the community, congratulations. Who was St. Joseph – a husband, a father, a carpenter and a provider? We also know that he is a listener. He listened to the angel who told him to take Mary into his house, he listened to the angel when he was told to go to Egypt, he listened when the angel told him to take the family to back to Israel and then another angel told him to bring the family to Nazareth. Perhaps from this quiet saint we could learn something from this saint – listen to others.
