#### Friar for the Assembly - Father Jeb Donelan

#### Dear Brother Knights:

May is a beautiful month, certainly because of the great weather, but also because of the many great celebrations. One of these dates coming up is May 1<sup>st</sup> what has become known traditionally in some places as May Day, or Labor Day in some countries and most importantly since 1955 has become the annual celebration of St. Joseph the Worker. Over the past couple of centuries rising communist ideology had transformed May 1<sup>st</sup> from what was a secular holiday, May Day, but not political into a day for celebrating workers. Sounds innocent enough, but the challenge was that the communist ideal of the worker excluded man's spiritual component. In other words, man's highest achievement was no longer attaining heaven but rather his contribution as a worker (certainly important in its own right). Pope Pius XII did not want the Church to be silent in this important discussion and so in 1955 established St. Joseph the Worker as liturgical feast for May 1<sup>st</sup>. The point was to show that the Church too wants to emphasize the dignity of the Worker and the work he does, while not loosing sight that man's greatest dignity is to be a child of God.

In this year of St. Joseph it might be a good time to stop and reflect on the importance and dignity of the work that we do each day. On the one hand it is important to reflect upon whether or not we are giving our best effort and working for a common good and the good of our family in the job that we hold. On the other hand it is also important to take time and rest and be sure that our work is not dominating our life (which can easily happen when we don't see the proper order of work in our life). Also as we reflect on the importance of work and the sacrifices we make each day for good of another May also gives us another opportunity to celebrate other important workers, those who have protected, defended and died for our country. Perhaps this Memorial day it would be just and good to bring many of those who died in defense of our country before St. Joseph, that he may help bring them to a happy resting place.
