Just Thinking...

Thank you, Lord

November starts with All Saints Day and All Souls Day, but for many Catholics, as most Americans, Thanksgiving highlights its calendar.

It ranks right up there with holidays like Christmas, Easter, and the 4th of July. Its hallmark is food rather than gratitude for the bulk of the population. (Pun intended.)

Pilgrims established Plymouth Colony, then gave thanks, with Native Americans as guests at their celebration. Yet, blood was shed before, even after that first three-day feast of gratitude to God.

President Washington declared Thursday, Nov. 26, 1789, a day of thanksgiving and prayer. In 1863, President Lincoln encouraged Americans to recognize the last Thursday of that month as a day of thanksgiving. Congress made the last Thursday in November a national holiday in 1870. In 1939, President Franklin Roosevelt moved the holiday to the third week of November to add a week for traditional Christmas shopping. That proved unpopular; the holiday reverted to the fourth week in 1941.

"Around 2 in 3 say they typically give thanks to family (68%) and God (67%), while 42% say they are grateful to their friends" on the holiday, according to an internet survey.

But what about the other 364 days? Do we whisper a short prayer of thanks when something good happens? Do we ask our Guardian Angel for help? Do parents still instruct children to say "please and thank you?"

Those rhetorical questions beg answers these days when good manners seem archaic. Do men and boys still open doors for women? When around adults, are children seen and not heard as customary a generation or two ago?

Civility has become a societal casualty. The middle finger is more common than giving the other driver the right of way.

Older Catholics remember when they were pupils; they waited patiently and silently while Sister Mary Alfred told Bob Uttermolen to shape up or his parents would get a phone call. His folks would not take his side. Sister could not be wrong. Litigation replaces forbearance without nuns. No rulers rapping knuckles these days.

Catholic parents should give thanks to laywomen and laymen who willingly educate their children even though they might get bigger checks as unionized public school teachers. The word is that these instructors are producing better pupils than their public school counterparts.

That churchgoers pay taxes for public schools and also support Catholic education is remarkable. That is but another reason to be thankful on a day more renowned for satisfied appetites than genuine gratitude to God for His gifts.
