Just Thinking...

Free Will Means Choosing

Gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Those storied gifts to the newborn Jesus from three wise men (probably Zoroastrian priests) prompt people to give everything from fruit cakes to diamonds at Christmas.

"Do your Christmas shopping early," is the cry of advertisers heard repeatedly as this major holiday approaches. The news media counts down shopping days to urge moms, dads, sweethearts, and just-friends to hire themselves to the nearest Bon Ton so that they might play Santa.

Storekeepers report that the bulk of their annual sales are at Christmas time. They would go broke were it not for this holiday tradition.

Nothing wrong with giving Christmas presents. In their way, they mark the holiday as festive. The Christmas spirit transcends Christianity; everybody – except essential public servants and those employed in restaurants and entertainment – gets a holiday.

Originally the word holiday meant holy day.

The Magi sought to do homage to a newborn king when they followed the star that shone on the stable in Bethlehem. Symbolically, these men represent the world's peoples to whom Jesus was the Messiah. He redeemed humanity stained with original sin and opened the gates of heaven.

Jesus became man eons after Adam and Eve gave in to pride, first among sins. And only God becoming a man was capable of making reparation. The Magi's gifts explain that. Gold stands for kingship, frankincense for worship, and myrrh for death and mourning.

Back to holiday giving. When the country was deep in the Depression, a stocking holding an orange and assorted nuts was a Christmas gift for many children.

Later, inflation spiked the price of gifts. Unfortunately, spending something extra out of love or respect can spark avarice in some greedy recipients. They judge a gift's value to score the giver's intent.

Christmas and giving have nearly become synonymous. Families gathering from near and far bear gifts. Even an inexpensive present is de rigueur.

This holy day's real significance is a memorial to Jesus becoming a babe so that some 33 years on He could sacrifice Himself on the cross to explate our sins.

A Midwest pastor in the 1940s always began his midnight Mass sermon retelling the Garden of Eden narrative wherein Satan entices Eve and Adam to disobey their Maker. That first sin demonstrates free will. God the Father gave that mark of humanity to us as a test — the exam we must pass to gain an eternal life of happiness. Had our First Parents obeyed, human behavior would have always conformed to God's will. We can only try to imagine how that would have affected human life today.

"The man and his wife were both naked, yet they felt no shame," Genesis says. They did feel that after the first sin. Maybe the Garden covered the entire globe, having a single, comfortable climate. Perhaps they and their progeny were intended to live blissfully, collecting food from plants needing no husbandry? The forbidden fruit that grew on the tree of knowledge had some particular purpose that only God knows.

It turned out that God gave Adam and Eve the freedom to choose. And they made an enormously terrible choice. Free will confers opportunities to please God by making good choices. His Catch-22 is that this freedom also can make us sinners
