Colonel John Fitzgerald (December 16, 1799)

After securing American independence, many of General George Washington's Continental Army Staff moved to Alexandria to be near their former Commander. One of Washington's closest friends was his Aide-de-Camp, Colonel John Fitzgerald, who served him faithfully throughout the Revolutionary War. In his own right, Colonel Fitzgerald played a significant role during the War. A prominent businessman and citizen of the Port City, he was elected and served as Mayor from 1786 to 1787. Washington and Fitzgerald remained close friends in the years following the War, during Washington's retirement and after his Presidency. What is not generally known is that General Washington played an important role as a founding father of Saint Mary Catholic Church, the first Catholic parish and cemetery in the Commonwealth of Virginia. With Colonel Fitzgerald and Colonel Robert Hooe, General Washington was among the original "subscribers to the building" of Saint Mary Chapel, begun in 1796 but never fully completed, at the corner of Church and South Washington Streets. Only a few years prior, laws prohibiting the practice of Catholicism were revoked in the Commonwealth. Constructed between 1826 and 1830, the granite church structure is located at 310 South Royal Street.
